COUNSELING CORNER



Hello MCAA Students and Parents,

Here we are mid-way through first semester and students are busy focusing on their current classes and future plans. Fall is always a busy time of year and this year is no exception. Below are just a few of the things students and parents should be aware of in the coming months:

The California State University (CSU) application window is now open. Seniors interested in attending a CSU campus should be working on their applications now since they are due November 30th, which will be here before we know it! Students should go to https://www2.calstate.edu/apply to access the new Cal State Apply application being used by the 23 campuses. The University of California (UC) application window is just around the corner as well. Students can be working on their application now, but the submission window for the UCs is November 1st – November 30th. Late applications will not be accepted. Visit http://admission.universityofcalifornia.edu/how-to-apply/personal-questions/freshman/index.html for helpful tips. Also, remember that all seniors who plan to attend a 4-year university right after high school must take the SAT or ACT at least once by December. Students can come into the Counseling Office anytime for help researching college entrance requirements, completing their applications, to get information about upcoming test dates or for any other assistance needed.

Another major piece of the college application process is financial aid. The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) for the 18-19 school year is now open. Students are encouraged to submit their FAF-SA as early as possible so colleges can process their financial aid awards earlier, giving students and families more time to make informed decisions about where to attend in the fall. MCAA offered a Cash for College Workshop on October 11th. Students who weren't able to make it to that, but need help completing the FAF-SA should stop by the Counseling Office.

October 11th was a busy day! In addition to the Cash for College Workshop that evening, MCAA also administered the PSAT to 40 juniors earlier in the day. This practice version of the SAT is a great opportunity for 4-year university bound students to get a taste of what to expect on one of the tests they will be required to take to be eligible to apply to a 4-year university. Way to go juniors!

Students of any age who are interested in attending a 4-year university after high school and would like to get a feel for campus life should consider attending preview days offered at several local colleges. These free events are open to all students and give families an opportunity to tour the campus, visit with campus representatives, and learn more about the school. Registration is typically online and should be completed prior to attending. Sacramento State will be hosting its "Future Hornet Day" on Saturday, October 14th from 1-4 pm. Cal State East Bay is also hosting a Preview Day on Oct. 14th from 8-12. Chico State's Preview Day is on Saturday, October 21st from 9-2. MCAA is planning to take a group of seniors to Chico State's Preview Day. Watch for information about our adventures in upcoming newsletters! For more information about UC Davis (or a variety of other campuses) consider attending an online chat session with Admissions on CollegeWeekLive (www.collegeweeklive.com). Students can also visit the UC Davis website to take a virtual tour or set up a campus visit.

Congratulations to Philippa Fuschich, the MCAA Student of the Quarter for 1st quarter! Each year the Marysville Exchange Club recognizes top seniors nominated by their high school. These students are selected for their academic record, involvement in school/community and leadership ability. Students and their families are invited to a luncheon where they receive a plaque and share a little bit about their accomplishments. All recipients are also encouraged to apply for the Youth of the Year scholarship which is the Exchange Club's national scholarship program. Way to go Pippa!

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


