Purpose of the Site Plan/LCAP/WASC Action Plan

Marysville Charter Academy for the Arts has developed a School Plan for Student Achievement (SPSA) that meets the essential guidelines of the "Every Student Succeeds Act" by ensuring:

- •all children have an opportunity to receive a fair, equitable, and high-quality education, and,
- •we work to close educational achievement gaps most prevalent among students with disabilities, low income students, minority students, and English learners.

Marysville Charter Academy for the Arts engages in timely and meaningful consultation with stakeholders both in the planning stage as well as the implementation of both our SPSA and LCAP, as we are a dependent Charter and must also create our own LCAP. Stakeholder groups review data and evaluate programs that target our historically low-performing groups of students. We have also crafted our WASC Schoolwide Action Plan with goals identical to our SPSA and LCAP, so that all plan goals, actions and serve as a guide for continued academic progress.

Reasons for Celebration

- MCAA received a six year WASC accreditation during the 2022-2023 school year.
- MCAA was again, this fall, named the #1 high school in the greater Yuba Sutter Area by U.S. News & World Report.
- An MCAA junior received this summer a \$40,000 Herb Alpert Foundation college scholarship through the California State Summer School for the Arts Program for her poetry.
- Three MCAA seniors were just awarded Letters of Commendation from the National Merit Scholarship Competition, ranking them in the top 3-4% of all students nationwide.

- The data shows us that we have cause to celebrate, especially in ELA, and still have room to grow, both in Math and Science
- There is also some Attendance & Discipline data that shows we have room to grow in attendance, but that we are meeting the district goals based on our first 20 days of school.
- As for discipline, we are holding steady with few incidents leading to suspension from school, especially during the first 20 days of school.

English Language Arts—CAASPP



Analysis:

*We grew at each grade level by 10%

Celebration:

*Double digit gains are definitely to be celebrated, as they aren't easily come by.

Targeted Needs/Areas of Growth:

*Would like to get closer to or cross over the 70% threshold for met or exceeded in all areas.

Mathematics—CAASPP



Analysis:


*We grew only by 1% in 7th grade, decreased 4% in 8th grade and achieved a 10% increase in 11th grade.

Celebration:

*The double digit increase in 11th grade scores is cause for celebration.

Targeted Needs/Areas of Growth: *We need to look more closely at 7th and 8th grade and work on filling gaps.

Science



Analysis:

*We gew in both 8th and 11th grade results.

Celebration:

*We grew by 5% in 8th grade results and by 4% in 11th grade results.

Targeted Needs/Areas of Growth: *We would like to get closer to the 50% threshold in 8th grade and cross it in 11th grade.

Attendance & Discipline

Analysis:

- Attendance data from the first 20 days of school over the past three years shows that we have slightly regressed from where we were two years ago (98.5% ADA in 21-22, 97.5% in 22-23 and 96.8% in 23-24).
- Discipline this year and last resulted in zero days of suspension during the first 20 days of school, but there were 2 days of suspension during the first 20 days of school in 21-22.

Celebration:

- Our percentage of chronically absent students has reduced from 30% in 21-22 to 15.3% in 23-24.
- Discipline resulting in suspensions continues to be rare.

Targeted Needs/Areas of Growth:

We need to work on our overall ADA percentage, although it reflects 96.8%, which is above the 95% goal.





Budget Summary


Funding Sources reflected in the LCAP/SPSA:
