Artist Statement: As an unconventional portrait photographer, one's subject is key to the outcome of a photo. My goal is to capture my subjects and their emotions while being shot. I felt like painting with light is the best way to accomplish this. I captured certain emotions by painting using different colors, patterns, or even symbols. Emotions are unpredictable, and because of this I was always working on my toes. This was a fun challenge, thinking on my feet and coming up with ideas in the moment. I had to start in a low light environment in order to be able to see any of the painted light. Second, I needed a long exposure time, roughly around 20 seconds so I could capture the painting and keep it in place. Then I needed a quick bright flash of light. This served two purposes. First was to freeze the model in place, second was to expose the image and make the model visible.

For "Shreya" | decided to represent love and life. I represented this using bright vibrant colors. I also used symbolism within the painting, drawing halos and hearts. Also, composing the models to pose with a certain ease in order to hit the emotions implied.

Photoshop was also used in order to bring out and brighten the photos.

- Service Opportunities



"Remember, we're here to lend a helping hand and make math less "problem"atic! Hope to "count" you among our enthusiastic attendees!"




SCIENCE DEPARTMENT

Our science students are already jumping into science. Physics students used their observation skills to learn why a burning tea bag floats in the air, built straw rockets and used toy cars to show how different frames of reference can change how someone makes observations. In AP Environmental Science we have looked at how the colors of both predator and prey in the sea change due to how light penetrates the ocean depths. This week students are dissecting owl pellets and using their data to calculate how much rodents an owl can eat in a year. In Science 8 and AP Physics, we are discussing the intricacies of motion and the math that comes with it. AP is already starting to feel the weight of math compared to previous science classes! In Chemistry, we have jumped right into the complexities of atoms and the periodic table and are getting close to starting our Element Projects.

ATTENDANCE NOTICE

Good attendance is extremely important for all of our students at MCAA. Here are a few friendly reminders about attendance policies at MCAA:

A minimum of 90% attendance is required for all students.

All legitimate absences must be cleared by a parent or guardian within **5 days** of the student's absence.

"Personal" will no longer be a valid reason for an excused absence. For any medical appointments, please provide a doctor's note.

The clearances must be made in the following ways:

Telephone call from the parent/guardian to the attendance office. If a voicemail is left, please list the student's name, exact date, and reason for the absence.

A note signed from the parent/guardian. No other signature is valid. The student's name, exact date of absence, and reason for absence.

Any uncleared absences will be treated as truancy.



A tardy is defined as any student not in their assigned seat in their assigned classroom when the tardy bell rings. Consequences of violations of this policy are as follows:

5 or more tardies = TARDY LETTER #1 = Detention or campus beautification.

10 or more tardies (after the first letter is given) = TARDY LETTER #2 = Detention of campus beautification.

15 or more tardies (after the student has earned letter #1 and #2) = TARDY LETTER #3 = In-house, or school site Saturday school.

20 or more tardies (after the student has earned letter #1, #2 and #3) = TARDY LETTER #4 = In-house or school site Saturday school.

25 or more tardies (after the student has earned letter #1, #2, #3 and #4) = TARDY LETTER #5 = 1 day suspension or District Saturday school or citation into SARB.

Students are required to attend all classes on the day of the performances, rehearsal or event.

Failure to do so will result in the student not being able to participate in the performance or event that day.
