Some of the traditions from Samhain were incorporated into this new celebration, which became known as All Saints Day. The night before All Saints Day was called All Hallows Eve, and eventually, it became known as Halloween.

As time went on, Halloween changed and became a day filled with fun activities.

America did not adopt Halloween until the late 19th century after the influx of a large amount of emigrants, even though there were fall celebrations across the country. People started going trick-or-treating, which was based on the old English tradition to go from house to house asking for treats. Carving jack-o-lanterns also became a popular tradition. As a way to keep away spirits, people would carve turnips' and carrots alongside festive gatherings and wearing costumes. Of course, eating treats is also a big part of Halloween!
